SECTION 7 - HEALTH HAZARDS AND FIRST AID

Effects of Overexposure:
Primary Route of Entry:
Skin: Slight irritation.

Eyes: Burning and irritation.

Inhalation: Dizziness, drowsiness, throat irritation.

Ingestion: Abdominal pain, nausea, diarrhea.

First Aid Procedures:

Skin: Wash affected areas with soap and water, seek medical attention if irritation occurs.
Eyes: Flush with large quantities of water, seek medical attention if irritation occurs.
Inhalation: Remove to fresh air and provide oxygen if breathing is difficult.
Ingestion: Seek medical attention.
